Set up your library in Google Scholar

1. Go to [Google Scholar](#) and select Sign In.

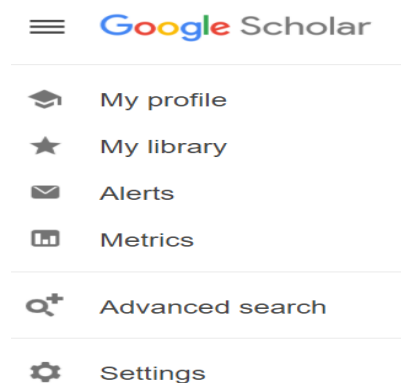

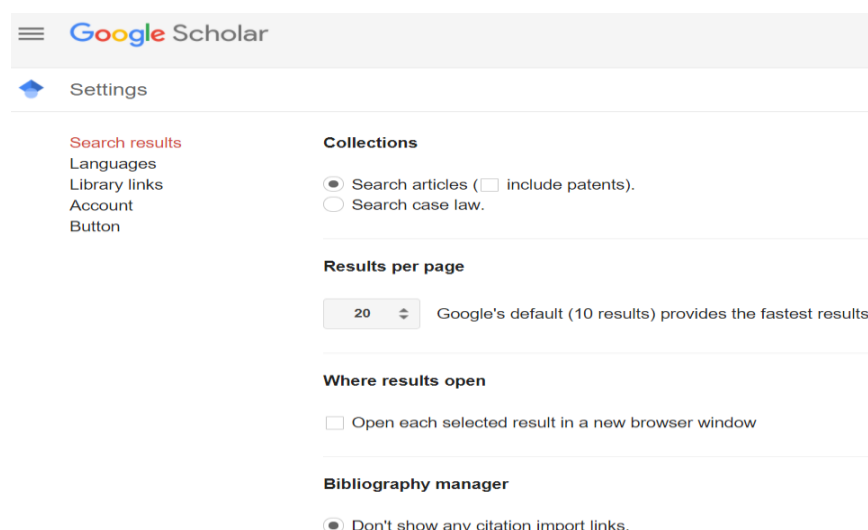
4. Select the three lines at the top left-hand corner of the screen.



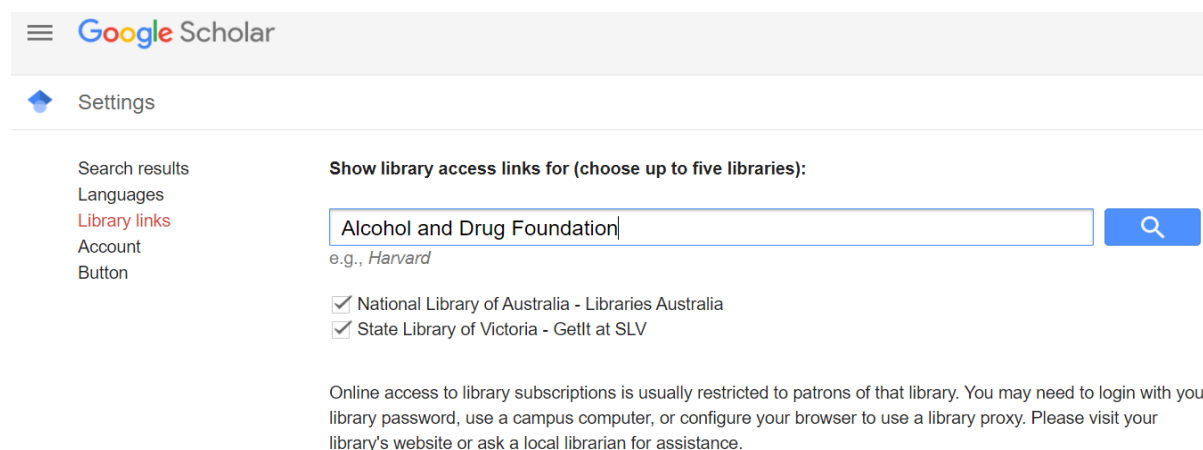
5. Select Settings

7. Add the libraries to which you have access to their electronic collections. Add the name and press enter.



8. Tick the box next to Alcohol and Drug Foundation – Full text at ADF Library and select Save.

9. Insert your search terms and select Search. When you see a link to Full text at ADF Library, select it or select the HTML version.
